

# Patients registered at a GP practice

## October 2017; Special Topic - Practice list size comparison

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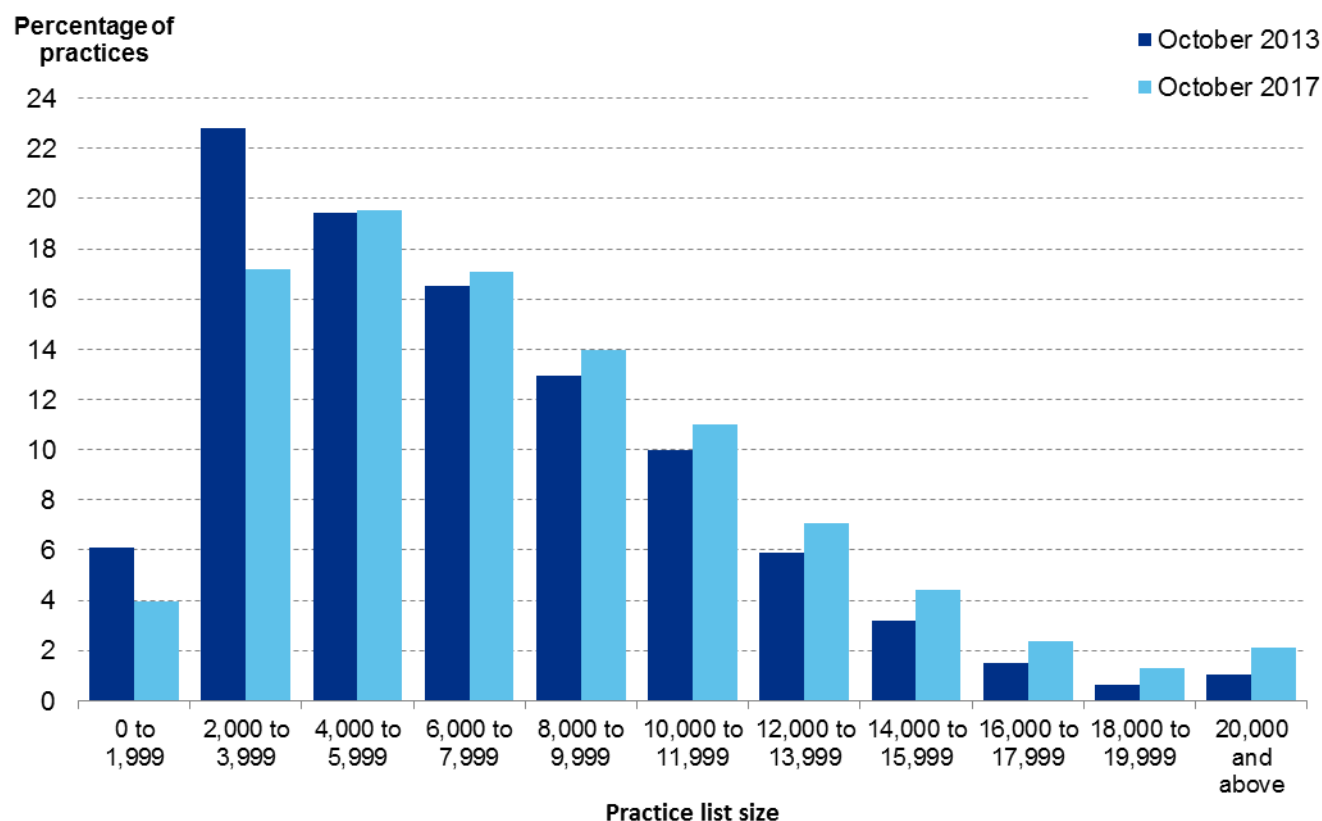
A comparison of the proportion of practices, grouped by practice list size - in October 2013 and October 2017.

### Key findings

#### England

- In October 2013 the largest proportion of practices (22.8 per cent) had between 2,000 and 3,999 registered patients.
- In October 2017 the largest proportion of practices (19.5 per cent) had between 4,000 and 5,999 registered patients.
- Total number of registered patients have risen (56,272,105 to 58,719,921) whilst the number of practices have fallen (8,032 to 7,358).
